some exercises

- 3. While Phemius was still singing Odysseus began to shoot arrows from his bow at the suitors; he missed a few but struck most.
- 4. Why are the Athenians delaying (use $\mu \epsilon \lambda \lambda \omega$ + pres. inf.) the expedition and fulfilling their promises? (Try also with "They asked why...")
- 5. In fear that he would be hit by one of Telemachus' arrows Amphinomus was about to hurl a chair at him, but he missed.
