some grammar topics: epsilon contracts in the middle, contract futures, future deponents, thematic root aorists, 2nd perfects (with present meaning), consonant stem middle/passive perfects, - $\mu$  verb conjugation, supplementary participles with  $\tau \nu \gamma \chi \dot{\alpha} \nu \omega$  (vs. infinitives),  $\dot{\alpha} \gamma \gamma \dot{\epsilon} \lambda \lambda \omega$  in indirect speech (takes all three constructions)
